Mental Health Diagnosis: Authorized to diagnose and treat DSM-5 classified mental health disorders

Substance Use Disorder Diagnosis: Authorized to evaluate, diagnose, and treat ASAM classified substance use disorders

Higher Education Requirement: 2-year or higher degree required

Counsels Clients: Conducts groups, one-on-one meetings/counseling, and referrals

Supervision: Agency determines (a), consults with senior clinician (c), directly supervised (d), practices independently (i),

Case Management: Provides case management services

Practices Outside of Clinical Setting: Can practice in community or home settings outside of a clinic or other behavioral health facility

Culturally Specific Services: Job description specifies offering culturally-aligned services

Billing: Can bill at, or at a percentage of, the encounter rate
